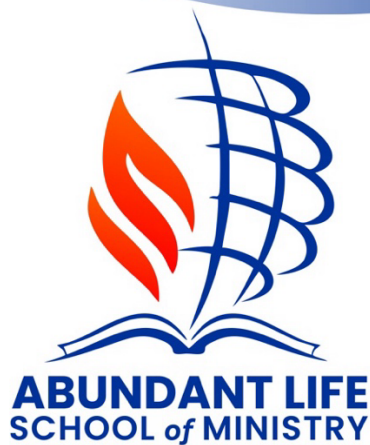

TUITION & FEES

Registration Fee: \$200 (Non-Refundable)

Tuition: \$1,000

ALSOM does not participate in any Government Student Aid / Financing of tuition. Your academic and financial requirements should be kept up to the required standard.

TUITION REFUND POLICY

Any student wishing to withdraw from a course must make a request in writing, during the first two weeks after their registration. Tuition refund only applies to tuition paid in full. Tuition will be refunded according to the policy below:

- A. Within 15 days from the date of enrollment, 80% refund.
- B. 15 days after the date of enrollment, no refund.

The withdrawal date is the date the written notification is received by ALSOM. This date will be used to calculate the amount of any tuition to be refunded.

ACADEMIC COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

MHS 101 The Ministry and Gifts of the Holy Spirit: This course covers a brief history of the Holy Spirit in the church, and practical applications for ministry in various settings. It will explore the role, nature and work of the Holy Spirit within the early church and ministry. It will give an overview of the nine gifts and how they equip believers for ministry. There will be prophetic activation and commissioning.

ONTS 102 Old and New Testament Survey: A sweeping overview of God's working from creation through the early days of His chosen people, with a focus on law, history, the writings of the prophets and how their message is relevant today. The study of the contents of Matthew through Revelation weaves around the central theme of the person of the Lord Jesus Christ.

HERM 104 Hermeneutics: The art and science of interpreting Biblical principles and interpretation of literal and multiple meanings of scripture. This course introduces the best practice methods to interpret biblical passages in their historical, cultural, grammatical, and theological context.

CFA 113 Church Finance and Church Administration: This course covers the fundamental concepts and practices of managing a church's resources, including finances, personnel, and physical facilities. The course will explore biblical principles of stewardship, leadership, and management, while also providing practical skills for effective church administration.

PPSW 103 Principles of Prayer Spiritual Warfare: This course emphasizes the importance of prayer as a vital aspect of the Christian's life, and how it can be used to overcome spiritual opposition and experience God's power in the lives of believers. It examines the biblical principles of prayer and spiritual warfare, equipping students to understand and engage in effective prayer life and spiritual warfare.

CCL 105 21st Century Christian Leadership: This class is designed for leaders to focus on development, training, and understanding Biblical principles of leadership, according to the Word of God.

CHE 107 Christian Ethics: This course gives an overview of ethics from the general perspective and draws a comparison between Christian ethics and secular ethics. Topics covered include ethical behavior in relationships, work and business, social justice, political authority, among others.

HOM 106 Homiletics: This course explores the art and science of preaching, sermon preparation, construction, and delivery within a religious or theological context. It covers various aspects of effective communication, including understanding the text, interpreting it, and conveying the message in a way that resonates with the audience.

PDSC 108 Personal Development and Spiritual Coaching: This course explores the connectivity of personal development and spiritual coaching, providing students with the knowledge and skills to guide them on their journey of self-discovery and spiritual growth. Various coaching techniques, and ethical considerations relevant to supporting individuals in their pursuit of purpose and fulfillment will be used.

PCOU 109 Principles of Pastoral Counseling: This course aims to equip leaders with foundational knowledge and skills for effective pastoral care, focusing on developing self-awareness, understanding key principles, and acquiring practical skills for offering spiritual support and follow-up.

PFSL 110 Principles for Success in Life: This course focuses on principles for success in life and explores topics such as self-awareness, motivation, self-management, emotional intelligence, goal setting, and building strong interpersonal relationships.

WCE 111 Wealth Creation and Entrepreneurship: This course covers the process of identifying opportunities, developing business plans, securing resources, and managing the growth of new ventures, ultimately enabling students to understand the strategies and tactics of successful entrepreneurial venture.

MNT 114 The Ministry and New Technology: This course empowers ministry leaders to integrate technology into their calling. It covers foundational digital tools, strategies for online engagement, media production basics, and personal branding. Students will gain hands-on experience through a short internship project and leave equipped to lead effectively in the digital age.

CTC 112 The Church and the Community: This course explores the relationship between the church and the community, focusing on how churches can serve as agents of transformation through spiritual, social, economic, and political engagement. Students will examine historical and contemporary models of community involvement, explore the theological foundations for community engagement, and evaluate the practical steps churches can take to positively influence their local and global contexts.
